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Just Got Bitten or Scratched?

- 1. First aid must be administered to the bite/scratch area. It is strongly recommended that the staff or volunteer seek medical attention from a primary health care practitioner. Please DO NOT treat a bite/scratch if you have not been trained to do so. If it is an emergency situation call 911 for assistance.
- 2. The bite or scratch must be reported to an immediate supervisor.
- 3. A Public Health Rabies Exposure Form must be completed and Public Health must be notified if there is a bite or scratch that breaks the skin from any domestic or wild animal.
- 4. WSIB notification if an employee receives health care (outside of on-site first aid) or is absent from work due to an animal bite or scratch, WSIB must be notified by completing a Form 7. Only employees are covered by WSIB. Volunteers are not covered through WSIB and would not require a Form 7 to be completed.
- 5. An incident report must be completed for an employee if no Form 7 is necessary as described above. For bite/scratches to volunteers, an incident report must be completed and forwarded to the Human Resources Department for our health and safety records.
